## The Sommeliers Recommendations

*On this page I will list some wines you may not normally look at. It may be that you have never heard of them so are not sure how they taste, so I will give a brief description of the wine and recommend some dishes from our menu.*

### White Wine

2007 Sannio Fiano, Pelike, Oppida Aminea, Campania, Italy

*A really outstanding white wine, with tropical fruits, rich with a lovely creamy character, harmonious balance with a long elegant finish. A great wine which is a great a complement to all fish dishes.*

2009 Crasto, Quinta do Crasto, Douro Valley, Portugal

*Bright and pale lemon yellow in the glass with an enticing minerality on the nose followed up with crunchy green apple, camomile and lemons. Fresh attack on the palate leading into a fresh and crisp finish. This wine would go very well with the Dover sole.*

### Red Wine

2009 Moreson, Miss Molly, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Coastal Region, S. Africa

*A fresh, ripe wine with concentrated berry fruit. Full-bodied with oak overtones, ending in a soft dry finish. Miss Molly would go well along side the liver or lamb dishes.*

2008 Malbec Reserve, Bodegas Santa Ana, Mendoza, Argentina

*A powerful aromatic wine, showing concentrated stone fruit aromas such as plums and prunes with a hint of spicy oak. Medium to full bodied with a stylish balance between black fruit, tightly knit fine grained tannin and judicious use of oak. This would go well with the rib eye steak, especially with the peppercorn sauce.*

### Dessert Wine

2006 Yering Station, Late Harvest Riesling, Yarra Valley, Australia

*Amazing balance of viscosity and acidity. Luscious honey with freshness of Nashi pear*

*and lemon, complemented by great natural acidity and minerality. This would go well with fruit based desserts.*

## Peter Michael Wines - Vins du Patron

*In 1982 Sir Peter Michael established the Peter Michael Winery on a square mile of rocky volcanic ridges that form the western face of Mount St. Helena in Sonoma County. From the beginning, the wine growing philosophy was modelled on the French tradition infused with a few modern influences; One, the vineyard terroir would be the single most important feature. Two, the wines would be elegant rather than overstated. Three, there would be a hundred-year commitment to the development of a great estate.*

## House Champagne ~ Taittinger ~ The History

*The origins of Champagne Taittinger date back to the original house founded in 1734 by Jacques Fourneaux. However its links to the Taittinger family started in 1931 when it was purchased by the founder of today's company; Pierre Taittinger.*

*As a young cavalry officer in the 1st World War he spent much time in the Champagne area where he was stationed at Château de la Marquetterie in Pierry, near Epernay. The Chateau's name is thought to originate from the appearance of the vineyard as it resembled a huge XV111e century chessboard at the time of its naming with plantings of white Chardonnay grapes alongside black Pinot Grapes. Today it is planted to a more conventional layout but still produces top quality Chardonnay and Pinot Noir fruit.*

*He instantly fell in love with the property along with its fine vineyards and after the war in 1932, purchased it a year after he had bought the Fourneaux Company. Today it remains owned and managed by the Taittinger family and is headed up by Pierre Emmanuel Taittinger.*

*The Taittinger headquarters are in Reims, situated above magnificent 4th Century Roman cellars which at one time belonged to the Benedictine monks of the abbey of St Nicaise. Its miles of tunnels and cellars are perfect for the slow but necessary ageing process involved in making this great Champagne.*

*The hallmark of the Taittinger blend is the high percentage of Chardonnay it contains, this gives the wines ultimate elegance, delicacy and finesse. This can be anything from 40% in the Brut Reserve NV to 100% in the prestigious Comtes de Champagne Blanc de Blancs and we know through research that it is enjoyed by 'independently minded' people.*

*In the UK this has led us to develop partnerships with like minded associations: Aston Martin Racing, Aston Martin Owner's Club, BAFTA - the British Academy of Film and Television Arts, Conde Nast Johansens, Highclere Thoroughbred Racing but to name a few.*

*The grapes are the key natural element, which contribute to the character of Champagne. There are only three varieties grown in Champagne. The Pinot Noir is the more noble of the two black grapes and lends the wine bouquet, depth, full body and complexity; the Pinot Meunier the more prolific variety, adds roundness and acidity. The white variety is the Chardonnay grape, the most fragile and costly of the three; it lends elegance, finesse and delicacy to the wine, lightening the fuller, richer, characteristics of the black grapes*

*The excellence of the wines in Champagne is due largely to its soils. The deep chalky subsoils, covered by a layer of siliceous clay below Jurassic formation named after the village of Kimmeridge in Dorset.*

*By virtue of its climate, the Champagne vineyard is a difficult mistress. The most northern of France's vineyards, it enjoys not only less sunshine but a greater threat of frost. Here more than elsewhere the vineyard's aspect is important: the most favourable situation is roughly one third up the slope, out of the valley fogs but not at an unprotected height, and facing south west, to gain maximum hours of afternoon sun*

*Taittinger owns 288 hectares of vineyards in the best localities of Champagne. The most famous of these are the vineyards surrounding Château de la Marquetterie*

*This ensures a regular supply of approximately 50% of Taittinger's annual needs significantly more than other well known Champagne houses. The remaining 50% come from carefully selected growers, some of whose links go back four generations. As quality is of paramount importance, Taittinger only uses grapes from the finest vineyards in Champagne.*

*All the Chardonnay grapes used in the Comtes de Champagne Blanc de Blancs come from the 100% rated vineyards of Avize, Cramant, Chouilly and Les-Mesnil-Sur-Oger in the Côte des Blancs.*

*All the vineyards are managed under the careful eye of Vincent Collard Champagne Taittinger's vineyard manager.*

\*R.D. means recently disgorged.

*Dérgorgement is the process where the lees after the wine has aged in the bottle is removed from bottle after Riddling. Riddling is where the lees is collected in the neck of the bottle, this is done either by hand on Pupitres or mechanically on Gyropalettes. The Lees then needs to be removed (Dérgorgement), this used to be done very carefully by hand but now it is done mechanically. The neck of the bottle where the lees is, is then frozen. The bottle is opened and the pressure in the bottle forces the ice block out. The Dosage is then added, then corked. The time between the removal of the lees and the adding of the Dosage is very short so the champagne keeps it bubbles. Before Dérgorgement was introduced by Madame Clicquot in 1816 Champagne used to be cloudy.*

## Sparkling Wines

*Sparkling wine in most cases is made in the same way as Champagne but can not be called this if it does not come from the Champagne region in France. So this means you can still have very good quality sparkling wine but at a lower cost than Champagne, such as the Franciacorta Novalia from Italy or the Schramsberg from California.*

*In this section of the wine list I will be featuring a winery I feel would be interesting to look at, in more detail. I will probably choose smaller wineries that you may not have heard of, also this way I will try and feature all of the wines that they produce. This way it will give you a better insight into the particular winery I choose to feature.*



*"Our philosophy is really very simple to produce the best wine possible with the least impact to us and the environment.*

*In 2004 my wife and I sold our family farm in Scotland to move to New Zealand to set up our own vineyard. The farm had been in the family for 5 generations and with that in mind it has helped to sculpt our philosophy in New Zealand.*

*After all it is really only in the last 60 years that artificial fertilizers and sprays have been available to farmers to grow crops. Before that everything was grown organically and from the people that knew (like my grandparents) the food tasted better. *Proudly family owned, New Zealand, Urlar Estate produces outstanding single vineyard wines using organic and biodynamic principles.*

*Urlar is a Gaelic word that means "The Earth". Their desire is to bring an abundance of life back to their ancient soils so you can discover the purity of flavour inherent in the land.*

*They feel the only way to give integrity to this vision is to grow grapes and make wine utilising both organic and biodynamic principles.*

## Selected Winery



*The winery also supports a New Zealand based charity called "Catwalk".  
The CatWalk Spinal Cord Injury (SCI) Trust is dedicated to raising funds to  
support the body of scientific opinion which says a cure for spinal cord injury  
will be found.*

*Economic and environmental sustainability are their driving principals. The practices they use are about giving life back to the soil and managing the vineyard as a balanced sustainable farming unit. This includes organic practices such as recycling through composts and liquid manures and increasing plant bio diversity through inter-row crops. Their own Highland cow herd provide the manure to drive the composting process. The inter-row crop plantings is done in a seven year rotation, this maintains healthy soils full of life and bio diversity. Every year, one row in seven will be sowed in a variety of plants and beneficial flowers. Flowers, such as buckwheat, lupins and phacelia provide crucial protection to the vineyard attracting beneficial insects that will kill off unwanted pests that can destroy the fruit and vines. A good example of this is the Tasmanica Wasp which preys on the Leaf roller Caterpillar – a pest that causes harmful botrytis, a type of rot in the grape bunches. They use the biodynamic farming and gardening calendar, the rhythmic influences of the sun, moon, planets and stars are recognised and worked where possible.*

*A lot more is done in the winery, such as the use of solar power, clever design of the winery. The solar panels are so effective; they heat water to boiling point greatly reducing the use of gas and electricity for water heating. The boiling water also enables the winery to remove tartrates from the tanks thereby limiting the use of chemicals. The design of the winery has been in a way so there are sufficient properties to reduce energy cost in keeping barrels cool over the summer months. Also careful landscaping has been done to create natural habit for a variety of birds.*

*For all their commitment they where rewarded with the Hills Harvest and Gallagher innovation award.*

*After all the great care which is taken in the production, growing and harvesting of the grapes; great wines are produced.*

*They Produce 5 wines but only 3 are exported to the UK. I had the pleasure of having a private tasting with Angus (owner of Ular winery) recently, where we tasted the 3 available in the uk. A Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Gris and a Pinot Noir. All great wines but the one which stood out the most for me was the Pinot Gris, so much so that I have included it in my wine by the glass selection. Please have a glass or even a bottle to see if you agree with me on how stunning this wine is.*

*The other wines they produce are a Riesling and a noble Riesling. I did ask why the Riesling is not exported, Angus said that only a small production was made. But the Riesling may increase in production but only if the quality is not affected.*

*So watch this space you may see more Ular wines in the future but in the mean time please enjoy the ones we do have. All of the Ular wines on the list can be found in the "wines that give back" section.*

## Wines that give back

*I imagine you are thinking what on earth is this section of the list all about. As I am sure a lot of us are thinking more about the environment and what goes into our bodies. So a lot of winery are thinking a lot more as well about the environment and what goes into the making of their wines. This is not just because of the health reasons, some might think. But because they believe the less you do with the wine, it will taste more natural. So quite a few have gone down the organic and Biodynamic route and others are just using far less chemicals in their vineyards. Then others are giving to the local community in the form of charity. Hence the title of the section "Wine that give back".*

*Below I have selected a few wines which I feel are a good example of this way of making wine. I will give details on each wine and tell you what the winery has done in making of the wine for it to be included in this section.*

Their presence is essential for the sanity of the vines and for the production of grapes that are the purest possible expression of the land. Such careful care of the quality of the grapes allows yeasts and lactic bacteria to be controlled without the use of chemical products in complete respect of the wine's naturalness. In this symbiotic vision between man and nature TuttoNatura is defined as a "liquid landscape", the sincere expression of a unique territory. Also no sulfites are added at any phase of the production process.*

## **Wines that give back**

*During my research into all the wineries I have used in this section, I did not think I would be reading about fish, meaning Fish Friendly Farming®. I was like most of you, I am sure; fish/wine, how do they go together.*

*Well Fish Friendly Farming® is an organisation in the U.S. which encourages growing practices that protect the endangered Coho salmon and Steelhead trout. Their motto is "Because premium food and wine comes from a pristine environment"*

*The practices they use to achieve this are:-*

- soil and water conservation*
- restoration and revegetation of river banks along rivers and major creeks as well as small hillside creeks*
- repair and careful management of roads to reduce sediment*
- limited chemical use*
- removal/retrofit of migration barriers*

*By providing for the habitat needs of endangered salmon and steelhead, Fish Friendly Farming® benefits both the aquatic ecosystem and terrestrial wildlife.*
